Wilkinson Farm Park – Garden Project Update	Barb Carr, representing Healthy Communities of Pierce County, gave an update on the success of the Wilkinson Garden project. She reported that many groups are getting involved in the garden.	The Parks Commission fully supports the community garden.
	They would like to submit a larger plan to the City in the fall to request additional land to establish the community garden concept. They would also like to present organic gardening classes and education to the local community.	The garden group will work with Staff to develop their plan for expanding the community garden.
Cushman Gap Improvements	Marcos McGraw gave an update on the Cushman Trail Gap project along Soundview and Hollycroft. These improvements include widening the sidewalks, restriping for bike lanes and placement of directional signage.	The Parks Commission would like to give input when the signs are being considered. Commission Chair Goodwill expressed concern regarding signage along Kimball Drive and would like to see an alternate route using Erickson Street.

Ferry Landing View Point Wall	The ferry landing mural idea and the wall graffiti problem were discussed. A suggestion of painting the wall with anti-graffiti paint a couple of times a year was discussed as a possibility.
